Learning Showcase

One of the requests made by a parent in the parent/carer questionnaire was that we introduce some opportunities for them to look at their child's work in classrooms. We are pleased to announce that we are introducing this at the end of each term, starting from this term!

On 28th March, classrooms will be opened from 3:20pm – 3:50pm after school so that parents have the opportunity to stay with their child to look at their books and work and in FS some photos of the learning the children have done. All children MUST stay with the parent to share all of the incredible knowledge they have acquired during the term.

School will finish as normal at 3:15pm and staff will dismiss the children from their classroom as normal. We need to ensure that normal safeguarding procedures for releasing children are followed before the showcase starts. Parents who wish to attend the learning showcase should either arrive at 3:20pm or wait outside the classroom until 3:20pm.

If your child is in Y5 or Y6 and usually walks home, you are welcome to instruct them to wait in the classroom for you to arrive. If you have more than one child in school, you are welcome to visit each classroom.

As this is a new event, we may have to make tweaks and changes as we reflect on the success of the event. We will be taking feedback from parents after the event to see if there are ways you think we can improve them.

Earrings, Watches and Jewellery

Please note that children must not wear jewellery for school. This is a health and safety hazard. If children need to wear earrings, they must be a stud, not a hoop and all earrings must be removed for PE days. If children have recently had their ears pierced, on PE days, parents must cover stud earrings with plasters before coming to school. Children are allowed to wear a simple watch; however, these must not be smart watches of any kind.

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
