

**MEADOW VIEW PRIMARY SCHOOL
OFSTED FEEDBACK MEETING
4 DECEMBER 2019 AT 5.15PM**



NOTES FROM MEETING – STRICTLY IN CONFIDENCE

LA asked for the initials of the first and last name of everyone present plus their job title for recording in her report.

LA expressed her thanks to pupils and staff at Meadow View for their hospitality. She acknowledged that it had been a challenging 2 days for all concerned. Her comments are based upon the evaluation made over the 2 days and what the two inspectors have seen evidenced in this time period. LA stated that MVP pupils are lovely and come to school keen to learn. LA then delivered her grading for the 5 inspection areas and a grading for the overall inspection judgement. LA explained that her comments would be limited to a sentence for each area.

Quality of education – requires improvement (RI)

Because some systems to support teaching are not firmly in place. Teachers need training and support to enable them to put these in place.

Behaviour – requires improvement (RI)

There needs to be a review of behaviour systems so that staff feel happy and able to deal with behaviour issues. Some pupils said that they do not feel safe at school.

Personal development – good

Leadership and management – requires improvement (RI)

It was acknowledged that school knew what needed to be done to see improvement but that some actions needed to have been in place a lot sooner.

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) – requires improvement (RI)

The structure of teaching is not right for the pupils. They need to be given more opportunities to learn.

Overall judgement – requires improvement (RI)

The final inspection report which will be made available to the public will be structured differently from previous formats. It will not reflect the comments made today or the more detailed feedback given to the head. It is in a new format which has to be written around a specific style guideline.

There is a complaints procedure of school wants to use this.

You will be sent a post inspection survey for completion.

You may share this feedback with school staff and governors, but this is highly confidential at this stage and cannot be shared with anyone else.

The approved report will be published in 25 days. In the interim school will be sent a draft report to enable us to comment upon any factual inaccuracies. The draft report must not be shared with anyone else. The inspection findings will also be subject to Ofsted own internal QA process before the final report is published.

LA asked if anyone had any questions. VH asked if there would be a follow up monitoring visit from Ofsted. LA stated that as far as she was aware this wouldn't happen.
