This year is our 6th annual Governors' Awards. Each year we start the school year in September with a motivational assembly inspiring our children to work towards their own goals and aspirations together with the Governors' Awards. The categories were chosen to inspire children across a wide breadth of fields from 'The Arts' to Friendship, Academic Excellence to Honourable Sportsman. The inspiration is then continued throughout the year. We are also very honoured that two of our Awards are dedicated to two very special colleagues who sadly passed away in service from cancer. Many parents and children will remember Mrs Pooley and Mrs Currie and their dedication to the school. We want to keep their memory alive for the current and future children of Meadow View.

We then hold a Head Teacher and Governor Afternoon Tea for the 84 children in school on Friday 28th June.
